

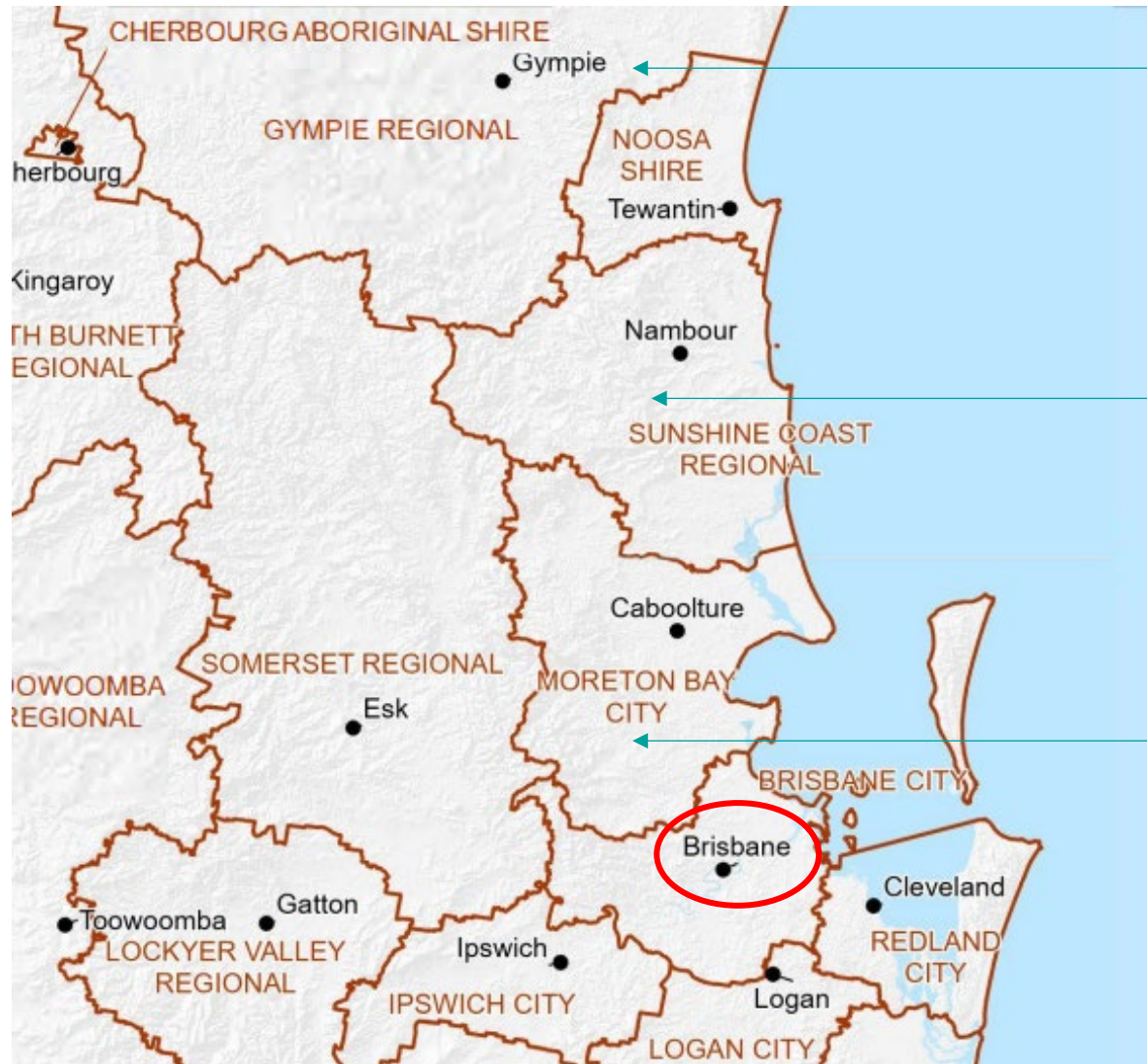

- Open coast, Moreton Bay Marine Park, tourism, populated along coastal fringe

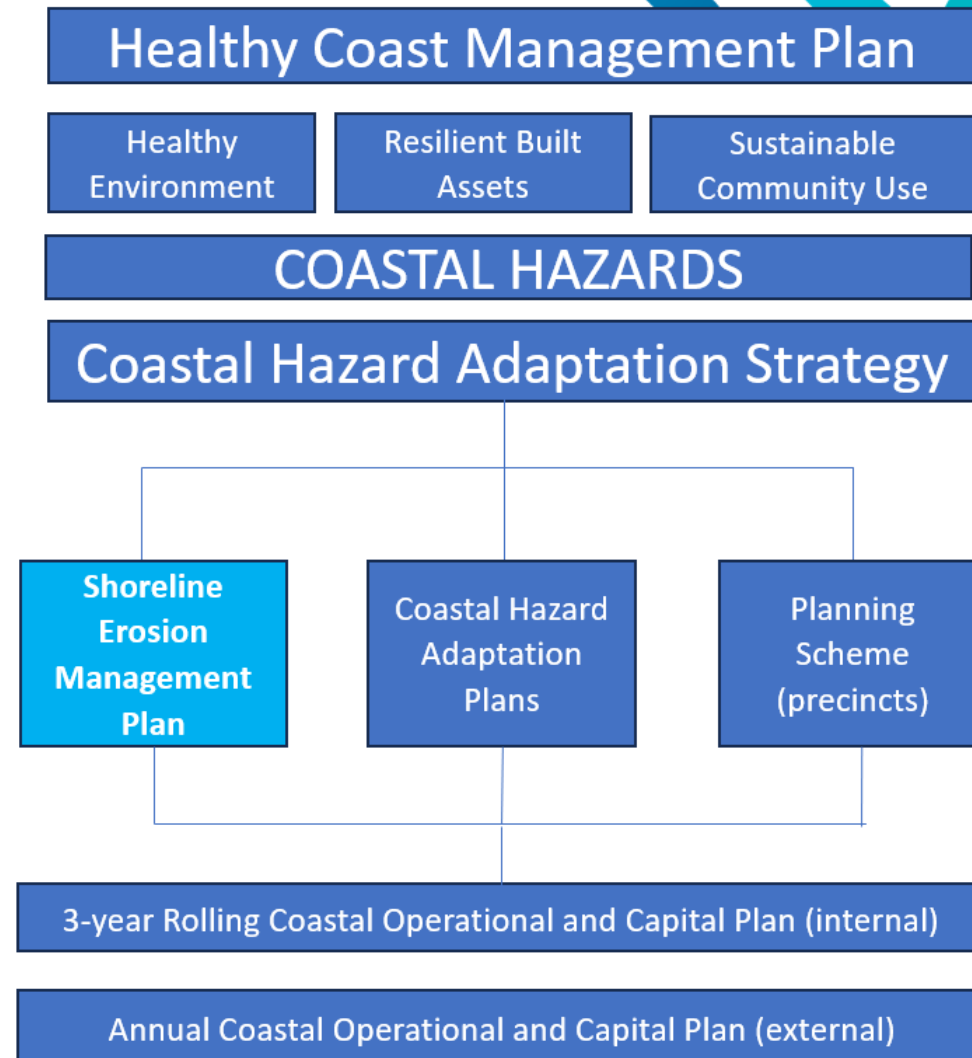
City of Moreton Bay

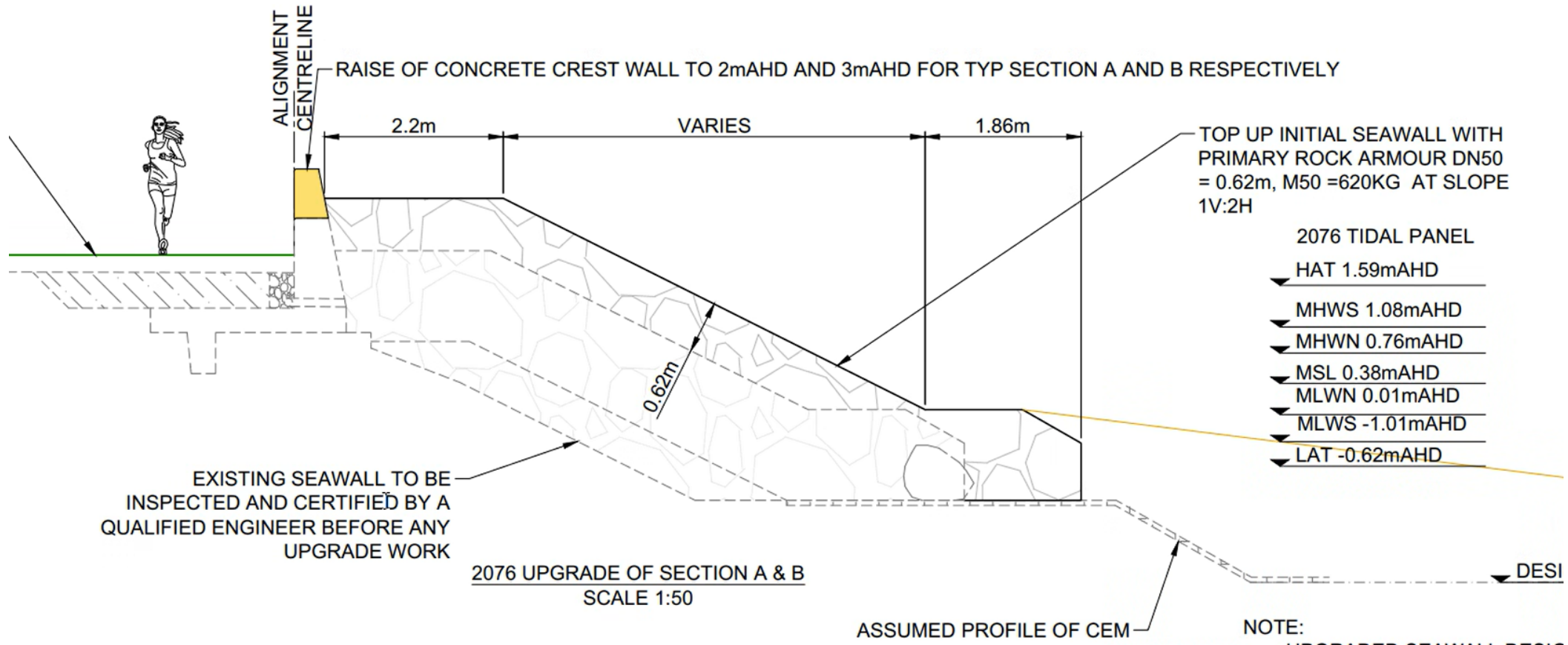

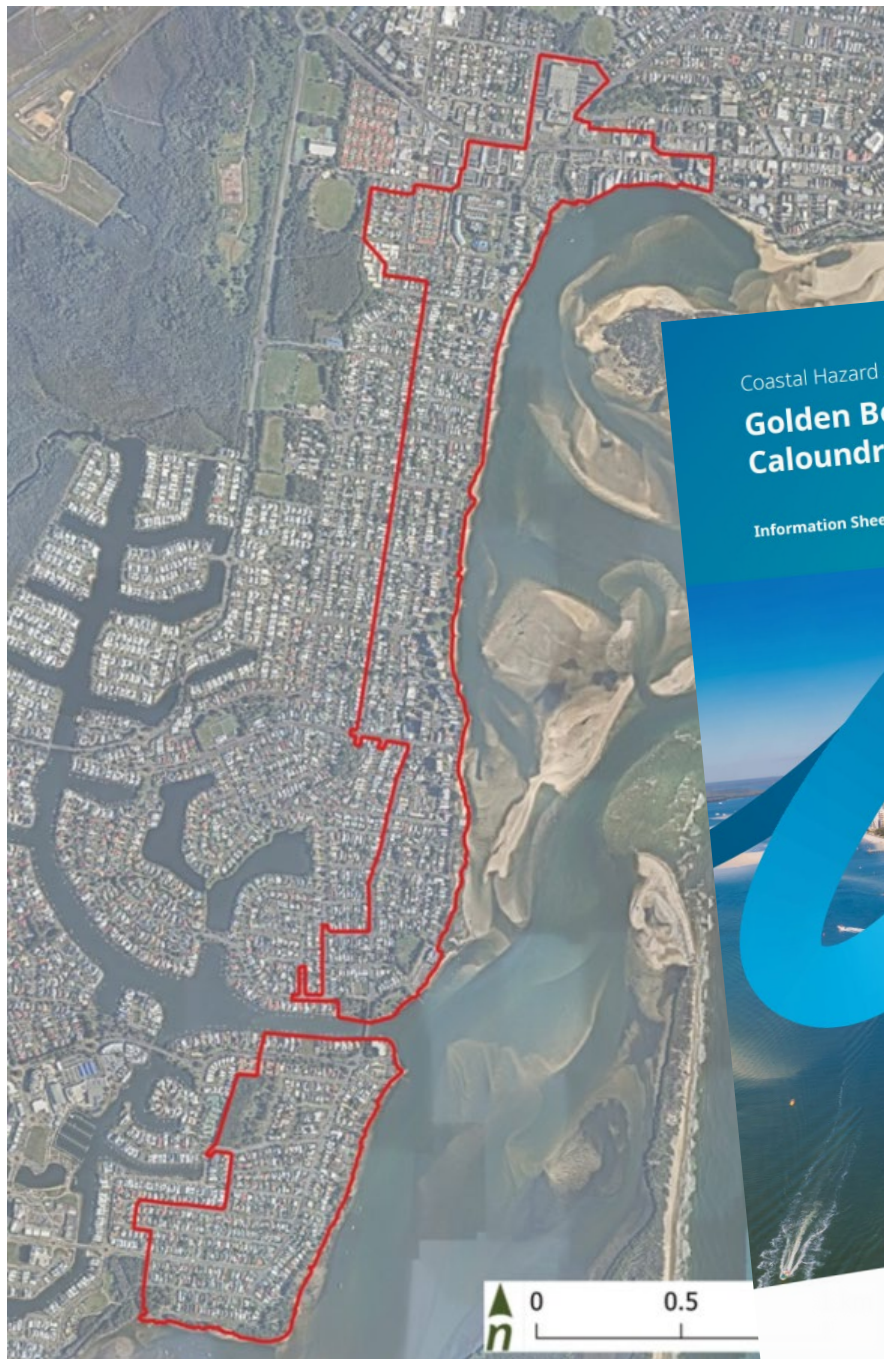

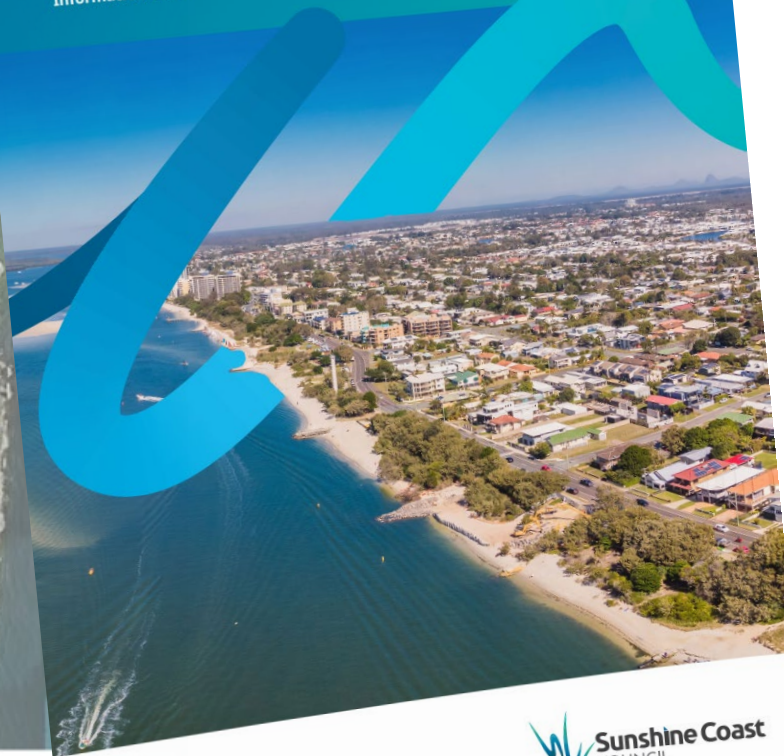

They also need to consider different timeframes, and how and when adaptation could occur.

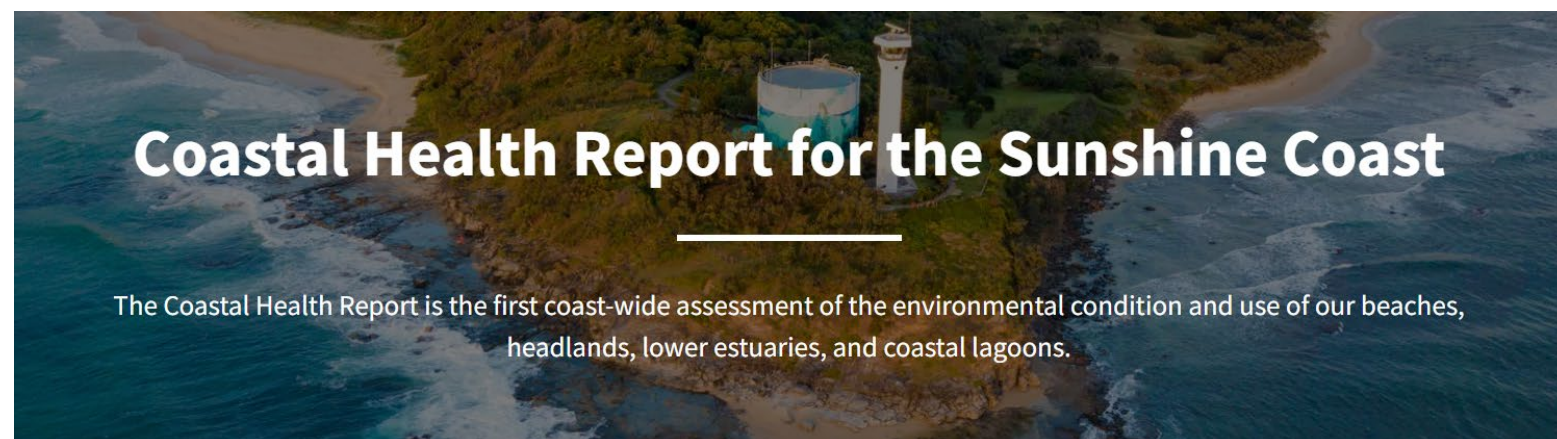
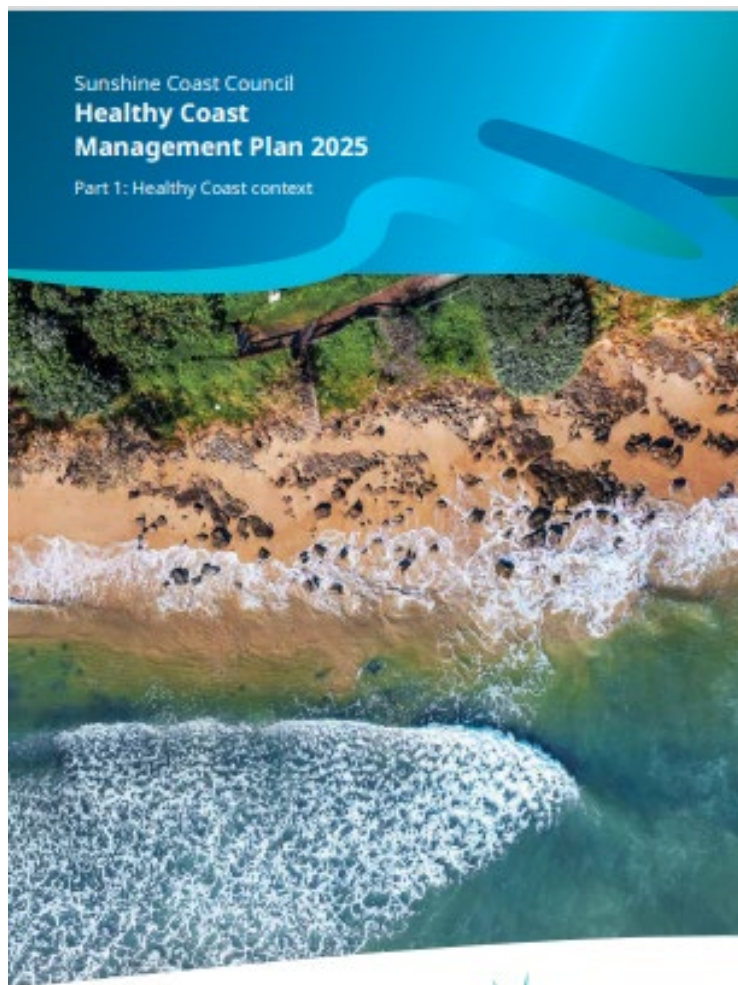
Beachmere Local Resilience Plan



Pathways:

- build a new seawall
- manage dunes and vegetation either long term or to delay the need for a seawall
- ensure the seawall you have is compliant and maintained.

Other Plans and Monitoring



The Coastal Health Report is the first coast-wide assessment of the environmental condition and use of our beaches, headlands, lower estuaries, and coastal lagoons.

Report cards are provided for 32 reporting units that cover the entire coastline with a focus on the following four monitoring themes.
