- 6 week consultation period
- 599 pageviews + 199 downloads
- 5 workshops + 5 meetings
- 137 participants
- 13 submissions
- Consultation Report
  - 28 key messages
  - 57 points of specific feedback
  - 7 recommendations with a response from the Executive Steering Committee



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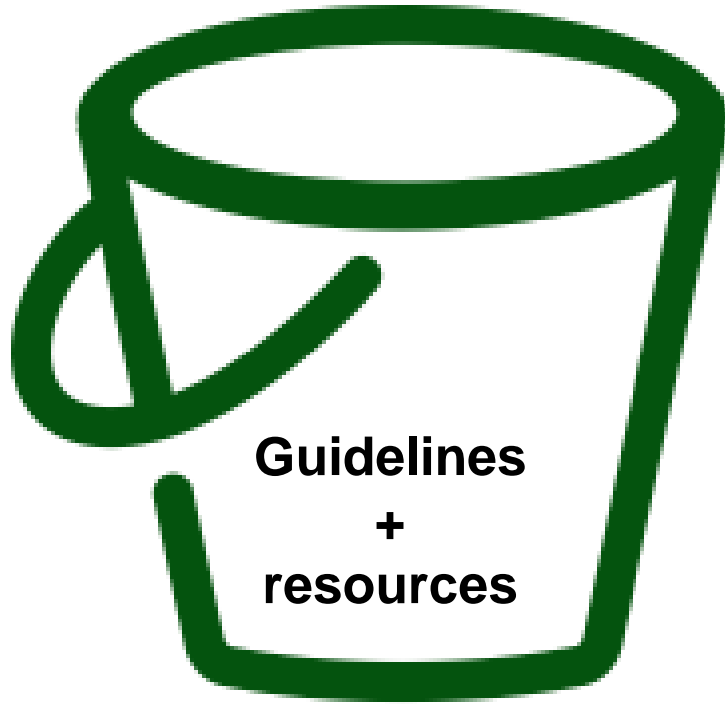
# Key messages
